Both clinics had great attendance, and we expect to hold the events again in 2025. AR-15 and MD Wear and Carry classes were held at the club. These were good events, but attendance was a little thin. We will hold future classes at the club, so please attend and take advantage of these opportunities. Trap and Skeet introduced a Wildcat clay shooting stand and targets for fun events at the club. Our members built the shooting stand, and it has been successful so far, so please give it a try. Weekly fun shoots are held on Saturdays, with other events being scheduled. Wild swings in the weather have caused havoc for the pond with very wet then very dry

conditions. Pond personnel have been monitoring the situation. CLUB NEWS TRAP/SKEET

Wild Clays (5-stand) is currently open on Saturdays 9AM to 1PM. This will change once the winter league starts November 2. Updates will be provided later. York-Adams Winter Skeet League starts November 2 and runs for weeks. All practice fields will be closed on the Saturdays of the league. Club Championship is November 3. Pump Gun Classic will be December 1, with the program to be posted at a later date. Central Penn Skeet League will begin the first weekend of January. This is a 100-bird shoot between 4 clubs: Carlisle, Cocalico, North American (Hagerstown, MD), and York-Adams. There are eight shoots, with each club holding two shoots. A banquet is held after all eight shoots are completed. The schedule will be posted to the website and Facebook. New shooters of any level are always welcome. If you would like to learn more about shooting Trap and Skeet, please contact the Trap/Skeet captain. The cost to shoot one round (25 targets) is \$5/members, \$6/non-members, and \$3/juniors. The cost of Wild Clays (5-stand) is \$8 per 25 targets. Cash or check only. Trap/Skeet is open Tues. 5PM-Dark, Wed. & Fri. 12PM-3PM, and Sun. 9AM-12PM.

INDOOR PISTOL

The William Penn Pistol League is in full swing. The indoor .22LR range is closed for league matches on the following Wednesdays from 4PM-10PM: 11/20, 12/11, 12/18, 1/22/25, 2/5, 2/19, 2/26, 3/26, and 4/2. We will also be hosting the Maryland State Pistol Championship on December 7 & 8. The indoor pistol range will be closed both days. If you have an interest in Precision Pistol (Bullseye) Shooting, please contact the indoor pistol captain.

ARCHERY

Indoor league will start January 8 and continue on Wednesdays at 7PM. Information can be found on the sign-up sheet in the Archery Range, and on Facebook. As of now, this will be the only shoot we will have.

FISH POND

We started the season by signing a contract for pond management with Aquatic Environmental Consultants Inc. Sign-off occurs at the beginning of each calendar year. After that, paperwork was submitted for trout stocking to the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission. A permit from the PAFBC is required each year to stock any species of fish into the club pond. The picnic tables were stained with wood preservative, and President Wayne Nickel made several new benches to place around the pond. April 13th was our annual Kids Fish Day, with approximately 275 children and adults attending. Anthony Miller and students from the Spring Grove High School Fishing Club helped on Kids Fish Day and throughout the school year, building and placing eight catfish spawning boxes into the pond. Turtle trapping started in July and ended on the last day of October. Nineteen red-bellied and seven snapping turtles were caught by Pastor Jeff Reaver and Jonah Martin. November will be the time for trout stocking for club members, with fish measuring 12-17 inches, sourced from Laurel Mill Trout Farm.

OUTDOOR PISTOL

Things at the pistol range have gone well, and the range is getting plenty of use. We will continue to repair the stands as they wear out and perform general maintenance. We are experimenting with new backing material to see if the stands can last longer.

RIFLE

Many changes have been happening at the rifle range. We are experimenting with new backing materials for the 100-yard range targets and have replaced the rest of the old wooden target stands with steel stands. We've made multiple repairs to the steel plates and will be purchasing new plates and steel targets this year. We renewed the hay bale with a wrapped bale to make it last longer. Two Project Appleseed Rifle Clinics were held and went very well. Additional clinics are being scheduled for 2025. One tentative date is the weekend of October 4 and 5, with another in September.
